As we prepare to cross the cosmic gate which signals that we are part of this Planet's life in the next millennium, this book must be one of our essential companions. I must confess that my primary and secondary education, BA, MS and Ph.D. did not prepare me to address many aspects of my every day life. Despite many years of formal education, these did not contribute much to teach me how attain peace on Earth and, more importantly, how to attain my own inner peace. That is why I believe this book is one of the most beautiful gifts that Lama Gangchen has given to humanity!

Reading this book (more than once) will enliven your hearts, as you will begin to see his clear vision of where humanity should be. This book presents in simple words his profound and unique understanding of life on Earth. It opens the holy space we all are searching for to finally live that personal encounter with the fundamental solutions to our uncertain future. A very beautiful collection of powerful messages on how to «Create a Peaceful Media Environment». Each chapter enlivens a singular aspect of our existence in ways I never thought it was possible. Reading this book felt like a masterfully crafted inner experience of becoming one's own reality and acquiring holistic self-empowerment. His thoughts will assist all of those who are trying to conquer their fears and will touch on the most intimate mechanisms of our existence.

As the next millennium approaches so rapidly, I always thought that the time has come to reflect on our achievements. It seems fundamental to evaluate our actions in relation to what we have accomplished as we attain different (hopefully higher) levels of welfare. However, after reading this book, more than once, I came to the realisation that such evaluation is not sufficient. The perspectives of Lama Gangchen call also for an evaluation of the legacy we are leaving behind, as our societies get (hopefully) better off. In essence, it is not a matter of what one has accomplished (as a person or as a society), but of what we have left for future generations.

Let us look at the record. From the point of view of our achievements, there seems to be a consensus that the «material» balance sheet of the world is much better than ever before. In terms of literacy, life expectancy, access to essential material goods and services, and the like, the last generations have not done so bad. Technological change has been one of the essential ingredients, allowing us to shorten distances; to communicate better, faster and cheaper; to understand life here on Earth and in other planets; to eliminate major diseases; to increase the productivity of our lands and avoid unnecessary famines, and so on.

However, in terms of our legacy, we see something more disheartening. Specifically, we see that in spite of the billions of dollars spent in the name of economic development, there are still 1.3 billion people who live with less than a dollar a day, and more than half a billion people who

suffer from severe malnutrition. Furthermore, there are approximately 600.000 women who die every year of complications during pregnancy and childbirth because they do not have access to health care, and there are thousands of children who die every day of diseases whose cures are well known. This is a century that will be remembered as one that left a legacy entitled «poverty». The same fragile balance permeates our natural environments, as the tropical rain forests are being depleted at alarming rates, wildlife and other bio-diversity resources are not sufficiently managed or protected, water and air pollution of many sorts are at its highest levels... This is a century that will be remembered as one that left a legacy entitled «environmental destruction». But, there is another dimension of this legacy: our inability to attain peace and social stability on Earth. And, this is where the book becomes mandatory to all of those who are engaged in decision-making. When historians begin to look back at the 20th Century, they will not only report on World War I and II - where so many people were killed and so many nations destroyed. In addition, they will report on the more than 100 wars or civil strifes that have taken the life of nearly 30 million people.

This will not be remembered as the century of peace. This century did not look at peace as the source of empowerment for humanity; on the contrary, empowerment has been sought through an arms race of alarming proportions that has become the most important threat to life on this planet. There has been the arms race by all nations - not only the rich nations - which has been used as an instrument of peace and stability. An approach that could not be farthest away from the sources and foundations of peace!

This is a century that will be remembered as one that left a legacy entitled «social deterioration and instability».

As one understands better the demographic projections regarding our future (e.g., population and urbanisation in the world), it is now clear that we will see the doubling of the world population in the early part of the next millennium. Thus, there will be a very large number of crowded cities, particularly in developing countries, and we are seeing that the risks of increased crime, drug addiction, social deterioration, unemployment, and the like, are extremely high. Therefore, it will not be unreasonable to expect a world with a large mass of younger people looking for work and an equally large group of elderly persons to whom the «productive» strata of the population will have to take care of.

All the economic, financial, social, ecological and political crises of today are the mirror images of the major spiritual crisis that the world lives today.

Good economics is only a necessary condition to eradicate the economic crises. By the same token, all the good financial, social, ecological and political practices within our societies seem to be several steps removed from the real and sustainable solution to their problems. And, it is no surprise then to see a number of paradoxes facing humanity today (e.g., food production is significant while malnutrition still exists, growth of material welfare is at its peak while poverty continues to increase). In the final hour of the day, actions confined to the economic, financial, ecological, social and political fields are just short-term palliatives. Lama Gangchen's message is clear in this respect: the real solution to major world problems requires us to adopt a set of «superior» values and goals that can only be developed and sustained within the inner space of our lives.

This book tells us that there is only one way out from these crises: peace. And, that peace is the sharp and shining diamond that must be used to carve a real and lasting prosperity on Earth. Now is the time to reflect upon our existing approaches to development and social change. We should ask ourselves if these are effective or even suitable to address the above mentioned legacies. This book teaches us that major transformations need to take place, and that these have their

origin exactly in the opposite «space» we have been using and relying upon in the past. The major lesson today is that the transformation process must start with inner change rather than with outer change. This is to say that: the source of peace and security is rooted in ourselves; the roots of change will not come from changing the outer notion of our lifestyles, but rather as a result of higher levels of consciousness and behaviour; and the quality of development and change will depend mainly on the quality of our decisions and our choices, all of which are a mirror image of our inner souls.

At the foundation of Lama Gangchen's message there is a key principle I fully share: that peace is the only source of (material and non-material) wealth and prosperity, environmental healing and conservation, and social stability.

The messages in this book show that a single-barrel approach to the creation and distribution of material wealth - enhanced through economic, social and political decisions anchored in the outer world - is not enough to resolve the fundamental problems we will face in the next millennium.

It is a fact that today's global problems need a different set of solutions. We have reached some level of «economic and financial fatigue». We have also reached «political fatigue». The world cannot depend only on such outer mechanisms, without understanding fully that at the root of markets and governments lies each and every one of us. We are the pillars of all the instrumentality we see «outside» us.

This book teaches us another way of making decisions: it teaches us that there are inferior and superior instruments to pursue progress or welfare enhancement and that we seem to be using inferior instruments to achieve superior states of human welfare; it teaches us that «peace» is a superior form of human welfare, and superior to any other objective we may articulate in the context of economic and social development. As long as we delay bringing peace to the core of decision making, the puzzle will always lack in essential pieces to make this a different world.

The beauty of Lama Gangchen's principles and philosophy is its simplicity. Our reality is essentially simple. Our life is simple. The truth is simple. He teaches us that fear, misunderstanding of who we are, our misconstrued attitudes towards money and wealth, our language and behavioural patterns, and some parts of our value and belief system have become the most effective blindfolding mechanism of our hearts and souls. We are the ones who make every aspect of life complicated! Within this context, Lama Gangchen: focuses on non-formal education as a centrepiece for teaching the real foundations of peace; assesses the media and its importance for peace making and peace loving; points out who is responsible for peace - all of us!! -; sees how even sports can be a source of peace or of its destruction; shares his vision of inner transformation and self-healing which begins not in the science but in the intuition and feeling level of humanity; assists us in walking from separation and duality - the here and there, the outer and the inner, the matter and the non-matter - to the essence of who we really are: oneness (one in all and all in one).

The most powerful realisation comes when the heart begins to read the book rather than our eyes or our brain. As the heart takes over, one begins to really understand peace environment, peace economy and peace development and progress. The boundaries between individual and collective actions or between individual and collective responsibilities begin to disappear, to enter into our world with total unity in purpose. Where, for example, the meaning of the word «globalisation» goes far beyond simple notions of trade and finances; rather, it penetrates into the foundations of who we really are and into our collective mission and responsibilities. Thus,

a person's pain from the negative impacts of globalisation becomes the pain of his or her community, the pain of the community becomes the pain of the nation, and the pain of any nation becomes our collective suffering.

The book brings Lama Gangchen's gift of transformation, from a paradigm of «to fit or not to fit» or «to win or not to win», to what was expressed so well by William Shakespeare: «to be or not to be». It is a call for bringing the economic, social, environmental and political structures we are so involved in these days into the «peace» and «being» dimensions of our lives, and for addressing inner violence as the source of our destruction as a civilisation. It teaches us that the solution to most of our «outer» problems begin with inner growth and evolution. The book presents the naked expression of the laws of nature, the laws of non-violence, and the laws of human rights, all inserted in the most beautiful constitution of the universe.

Thanks, Lama Gangchen for bringing to us the real message of peace on Earth. But most importantly, thank you for being the essence of peace!

A third millennium challenge to the media «become messengers of peace». Cultivate attitudes of non-violence by spreading positive messages.



In order to offer an alternative to these negative informations and to contribute towards the transformation of a culture of violence into a culture of peace, I wanted to see the birth of «Peace Times». Published quarterly, its focal point and strength will be in spreading news that yield good feelings. It shall primarily offer information about the Lama Gangchen World Peace Foundation's activities, which are the very testimonies of my efforts in showing how relevant the teachings of Buddha Shakyamuni and Lama Tsongkhapa still are today, and how they can be integrated into our daily life. «Peace Times» will however also be committed to reflecting the realities of other associations, foundations and spiritual traditions working for inner development and world peace. It will always be a product of the «good thought supermarket».

We will of course not forget the Global Open University, the Lama Gangchen International Peace Association and the Himalayan Amazon Andes Healing Arts Association which spread environmental culture with the use of tantric practices; nor will we forget about the World Peace Services Association which, in Milan organises dharma courses, Self-Healing courses, the art of sacred painting workshops, as well as traditional Tibetan medicine, astrology and massage courses. It further organises art exhibitions and concerts with, among others, the United Peace Voices who re-elaborate the antique Tibetan tradition through the sounds of modern world music; or still the Kunpen Lama Gangchen Institute successfully appealing to the public and finding generous people sponsoring the education of needy Tibetan

children, as well as economically helping various monasteries, schools, medical dispensaries and hospital in India, Nepal and Tibet. The Institute further finances fund-raising tours in Italy for groups of monks specializing in Cham dancing and the construction of sand mandalas. «Peace Times» will also share with you the experiences of the pilgrimages made throughout the world by the Foundation's group of peace messengers, and inform you about forthcoming pilgrimages. Even if until now, we have not had time for peace, the time has come for us to take on the commitment to heal ourselves, our society and the world by the power of the truth.

## Defeat fear, make peace triumph

Abandoning aggressive and self-destructive behaviour to live in harmony.

Become a spiritual gardener and cultivate the positive by following the principles of nonformal education and non-violence.

There is one solitary battle to fight: against fear. The fear to err; the fear of past mistakes; the fear of delusion; the fear of something unpleasant happening to us; fear manifests in a thousand ways. If we take a closer look even jealousy and pride are faces of fear. We are afraid of the street and we are afraid in the house with our wife or husband, with our children, with our parents. We are afraid to stay in a crowd and we are afraid to be alone. We are afraid in the face of scholastic education as well as ordinary education. We are afraid to be without money and we are afraid if we have a lot of money. We are afraid even of love. We are at the mercy of fear. Fear is our number one enemy, capable of generating violence in us and in society: we are afraid of others and therefore we use violence to protect ourselves; we are afraid of not being liked, of losing our beauty or our good fortune and so, violence runs wild inside us. We continuously live our lives finding ourselves swaying between aggressivity and self-destruction.

There is, however, a way to defeat fear: we can do it by cultivating inner peace. You may ask how? By transforming ourselves into humble, spiritual gardeners, passionately dedicated to yielding beautiful flowers of pure energy in the deep of our body and mind.

We start by purifying our inner ground, physical, mental and emotional. We then sow the seeds of peace. We tend them. And when our garden is in full bloom, we will have finally dispersed our fear and the other negative emotional bonds we are carrying inside, everything will be easier both in our daily life and in society.

Peace does not reign in the world because it does not reign within us. It is the inner peace of each living being which creates the base for universal peace.

In order to live in peace, we must educate ourselves to live without fear. Peace education is the only education which teaches us how to live in happiness; it is a non-formal educational method of positive thought and non-violence, and we all need it. Scientists need it just as politicians need it and so too psychologists, children, teachers and students... peace is the one morality that society needs, and it is the only thing which can help us to live even the most difficult situations without suffering. Governments' efforts to overcome the various causes for social violence are not enough. I propose to launch peace education programmes, mainly in elementary schools: men and women of the future could learn today to listen to their inner world and to transform emotions into positive thoughts and actions.

### Choose non-violent culture

Renounce the aggressivity and self-destruction of modern society. Stop fighting for enjoyment and rediscover a new possibility for your life through non-formal education.

Violence is everywhere. It is not only in the streets of big cities, but also inside our own mind. It lives inside us, continuously nestling between our thoughts and manifesting in frowns, harsh movements and angry words. It pollutes family relations, love, friendship and work; even children's games and sport activities reflect the culture of violence of modern society; we even fist fight for fun... We are so used to violence that we consider it normal.

Television, radio, cinema and newspapers continuously spread bad news, and so infiltrate our mental computers with a series of endless aggressive and self-destructive informations, to which we automatically refer to in our various daily behaviours. Consequently, our actions will be tinged with violence and negativity.

Nowadays, everything is streamlined by violence. World cultures resemble one another so much because they are all permeated with violence. Where is the ancient wisdom which made us interact in a peaceful and serene way whatever the relative reality.

We have ended up forgetting all those non-formal educational teachings, which in the past made us develop our intuitive abilities, our instinct, patience, understanding and tolerance. In a world which is so used to angry reactions, balanced on nervous tension, even to the extent of making it difficult to listen peacefully, the first step is simply to recognise the real state of affairs; change the course and travel towards a more just and more stable society, which is above all compassionate and wise. Suffice to decide no longer to live on the swing between negative emotions, prey to anger or depression and always victims of fear.

We must personally assume responsibility for giving a new base to a culture of peace, without expecting someone else to do it.

Let us turn the tables around and stop agreeing with our arrogance and selfishness: violence deserves no indulgence. Let us decide now to transform violence into non-violence, darkness into light, hate into love, just as tantra teaches us. Let us absolutely refute violence. Let us do it for ourselves - and let us be honest - we have had enough of enduring and inflicting, let us do something for the future generations who really have the right to a «possible» world to live in. The non-formal education of non-violence contributes towards the creation of more balanced individuals, able to form a peaceful and harmonious society, with the most absolute respect for the natural surrounding environment as well as its inhabitants.

Peace education does not end after one course, it lasts a lifetime. All we need is a good and altruistic motivation, and: the first to benefit from renewed peace will mainly be ourselves; and then our wife, our husband, our children...

Everything, even the hardest experiences life has in store for us, will have the taste and delicate scent of perfect original beauty in the culture of peace and universal harmony.

# Thumbs Up non-formal education

Some things are not taught in school. For this reason, even if we have a very high level of education, we often find ourselves in difficulty in our everyday life. The fact is that the knowledge we acquired from elementary school through to university level, does not help us to live in peace with ourselves and with others; it does not save us from the emotional vortex, it does not liberate us from doubt and from fear.

Non-formal education is a permanent process: it begins in the mother's womb and continues day after day; it supports us in accepting ageing, or in the case of illness.

Even at the time of death, non-formal education helps us to die in peace without ever abandoning our mental continuum. It is a deep form of education and at the same time very subtle, which unleashes the warmth of love. Nothing complicated: in essence we are taught how to cultivate inner peace to live in harmony with the nature of things. Its precepts are of help in our interpersonal and working relationships; they help us deal with any life situation with serenity and awareness, even those more painful. It is reflected in our way of looking, moving, talking and naturally thinking. Learning how to think in a positive way and creating space in one's mind is both possible and necessary.

All great religions have always treasured that which can be considered the fundamental principles of non-formal education.

The holy beings of any traditions, have all taught meditational methods to interact with one's own subconscious with pureness, as well as with that of the surrounding environment, in the name of the culture of non-violence and universal peace. Therefore, the contribution from spiritual traditions could be decisive in turning about the violent tendency which today distresses the world. 

We need to educate our children in choosing to practise and follow only those sports that go hand in hand with living in peace.

It has become of paramount concern that people should give growing attention to extreme sports, which are based on violent confrontations and danger: violent behaviour not only affects those performing, but also those who spectate: suffice to think about the terrible and frequent explosions of anger between opposing fans which plague football stadiums all around the world. The time has come for an urgent and sincere in-depth examination of the reality of sport and associated violent behaviour. As the World Cup is about to kick off in June, this is surely an opportune moment for everyone to reflect and meditate upon their own sporting behaviour. Let us rediscover the true values of sport. Enough with violence on the field. Let us transform violent sports into non-violent sports. And let us give ourselves whole heartedly to peace sports.



We also put the stability of our work, family and friendships at risk.

As far as the eco-system is concerned, it is obvious to anyone - from Rome to Beijing, from New York to Cape Town - that we are dangerously nearing collapse. Therefore, let us stop polluting the seas, the earth and the skies; let us put a stop to over-consumption, to littering the four corners of our planet unecessarily, to abuse electrical consumption.

We can have peace with us at all times: when we fall asleep and when we wake, during dreams and throughout the day, in every gesture, glance and word; the choice is ours, let us therefore choose peace, please!

### Life is made of this

### Millions are still deprived of the right to clean water

Water, more precious than gold or even oil. The one element without which there is no chance of life. Nothing new of course in this statement, but at long last the issue has come off the 'backburner' and is making headline news, since the United Nations meeting in the Hague last March, which brought together experts, scientists and politicians from around the world who, in a collective voice, underlined the fact that the world today leaves billions of people without water. For example in Africa, where in the depth of its womb, Mother Earth would be rich in water resources, that which is missing is therefore not water, but the will to make financial investments in order for water to become available to all. In the meantime, in third world countries still far too many people are without access to drinking water and have no adequate sanitation or running water in their homes. On another level, it can be said that sadly things are not much better in western countries where this naturally available element, indispensable to life, has become an object of monopoly by governments and is, in some countries, financially run by private companies.

Water has taken on the role of «the gold of the third millennium»: its use traces a clear separation between poor and rich, between developed and under developed, between clean and dirty...

In the west, with showers and baths, washing machines and dishwashers, sanitation and gardens to hose, we take the privilege of consuming some 300 litres of water a day per person. Whereas in poor countries, like in Tibet for example, at this very moment there are thousands of men, women, elderly and children who are forced to walk miles to bring a tiny amount of water to their home; water which comes from dubiously hygienic wells and which therefore contributes to the spreading of sicknesses and infections.

This water to them is so precious that they cannot even use it to wash themselves or to clean their clothes and the environment, and even less to irrigate their fields.

According to dharma, the spiritual tradition which takes its roots in the teachings given by Buddha Shakyamuni 2,500 years ago, water is a very important and essential element. If we consider that the human body is mainly made up of water (about 75%), and that even the planet has more water than earth (in the form of lakes, seas, oceans, rivers and geysers), and that since centuries teachings have been passed down on how to respect, purify, strengthen an element so important to life, we too can clearly appreciate the vital role of water for life.

We can learn how to meditate upon the Tibetan letter Bam, which represents the water element, both on the macrocosm and microcosm levels, and invoke the great water mother Lochana - a Buddhist female divinity, white in colour - and her spheric mandala, to request her help in healing and transforming the impure water element of our internal and external environment. Through concentrative meditation, we definitely develop more awareness and learn to better use our planet's water resources so that all living beings may drink pure water and so that animals and all other forms of life may be free from the danger of extinction.

According to traditional Tibetan medicine, the water element corresponds to the heart chakra, as well as relating to the kidneys, bladder, ears and hearing sense. It is the water element which is responsible for the circulation of body fluids, such as the blood stream, lymphatic system, and so forth.

By making heartfelt requests to the great water mother, it is possible to passify all immune system disturbances, any allergies and cold natured related illnesses, as well as any astrological problems and negative interferences deriving from the influences of Mars and Mercury.

On the environmental level, by invoking the great water mother, excessive monsoons, acid rainfalls, floods, storms and the excessive rise in sea levels can all be appeared.

Aside from meditating to purify the water element present in the body and the environment, we can and must commit ourselves to doing something on a concrete and material level, in syntony with the teachings of the 'awakened one', that is Buddha Shakyamuni. This is of course also true according to the teachings of Jesus Christ who said "give water to those who thirst".

For this reason, the Lama Gangchen World Peace Foundation's commitment to bringing water in a poor and and all but forgotten part of the world, such as the place in Tibet where I was born, near Shigatse, is something to follow with full determination and a sincere sense of achievement.

### From east to west

### Friendship in the name of spirituality and humanitarian aid

I was born and brought up in Tibet, in the "old Tibet" which existed before 1959. The Tibet of my youth was a society that had remained unchanged for centuries, profoundly permeated by spiritual values.

Due to circumstances, in the 80's, I was catapulted to the west, where I was immediately struck by the evidently deep suffering that surrounds the majority of people who live in this part of the world: stress, fear, doubt about the meaning of their own actions and of the value of their very existence.

Since then I have never stopped trying to share, with the greatest number of people possible, the invaluable patrimony of spiritual wisdom from my place of birth. The meditation practices taught by Buddha, and preserved for centuries in Tibet, can also be useful for those who belong to other religions and even for those people who only believe in finding personal happiness, inner harmony and peace of mind.

I have travelled the world spreading the NgalSo Self-Healing practice which condenses those antique teachings, and recently I have founded a centre of healing and meditation at Albagnano di Bee, near Lake Maggiore in Italy, with the aim of regularly transmitting the knowledge of dharma which offers new and more meaningful perspectives to daily life.

But I have never forgotten for even one day my own land, where people live in conditions of extreme poverty, without electricity and running water, without the support of primary social structures such as schools and hospitals. For this reason, I have dedicated myself to using every possible occasion to stimulate western people into helping humanitarian projects in Tibet. If it is true that Tibet can help western countries to develop a system of peace education, it is just as true that western countries can help Tibet to overcome their poverty. Help in Action, for example, collects money to help the poorest children and the most needy elderly people. The Association, which has its seat in Milan and is recognised by the Italian Government as a non-profit voluntary association of social utility, now counts more than 1000 sponsors (the majority of whom are Italian citizens, but also Swiss, German, French, Spanish, English and American) who financially sustain the same number of people living in Tibet or in the Tibetan refugee camps in India and Nepal. It does not take much to change the life of a person who is living in total poverty: with an amount equivalent to a pair of good shoes a child can be maintained in school for a whole year!

Moreover, for the past two years I have dedicated myself to finding the funds necessary to rebuild Gangchen Monastery, which was founded by my previous incarnation, to guarantee through its existence concrete help and full solidarity for the entire population of the area, as well as to preserve the unique teachings that have been passed down from guru to disciple for centuries. That which I propose is a reciprocal exchange between the east and the west, where each side offers that which is most easily available to them: Asia gifts peace to individuals and therefore offers a base for world peace, the west finances projects of social development. These aims, whether in the east or west, are equally important: they deal with healing diverse and difficult situations to return a sense of dignity to living beings.

The first results are encouraging: Gangchen Village has been reborn with the realisation of the new monastery and medical clinic, both built with thanks to the financial commitment of westerners; and the village of Albagnano also has something to look forward to with the beginning of Dharma courses and the arrival of many people who want to develop their own spirituality.

Many years ago, I left my monastery and the social status reserved in the east for reincarnated spiritual leaders to live in the west. I travel continuously propagating a message of inner peace, self-healing and environmental care. My principal spiritual practice is, in fact, based upon the development of inner peace. I have no knowledge or particular interest in politics; my only wish is to somehow contribute to the creation world peace.

We are now in the era of kaliyuga, the age of the five degenerations. The inner worlds of both people and the planet are restless and angry; the elements of the container (the earth) and of the contents (living beings) are seriously imbalanced and polluted. In these times, negative emotions and mistaken viewpoints are prevalent, death arrives all too easily and the global situation is fragile and dangerous.

Throughout history, various secular educational systems have been developed which, in some ways, have proved to be inadequate or difficult to enact. There also exist already many peace structures and systems, which are wonderful, but unfortuantely these alone are not sufficient to satisfy all the needs of living beings. For this very reason today, at the beginning of the third millennium, it is necessary for religious leaders to seriously assume responsibility for the future of humanity and the planet by uniting to resolve the innumerable problems which torment the XXI century. It is their responsibilty, and that of every practitioner, to build a solid foundation which makes inner peace education available to all.

All spiritual traditions and religions are rich in educational methods to develop inner peace which, however, have no weight in our modern society. To rediscover these ancient peace teachings religious leaders have to present them in a new updated package - adapted to the mentality of the new generations. The development of inner peace is a fundamental necessity of human beings, like food, clothes, shelter...

I am certain that the spiritual traditions can save humanity and contribute to the creation of world peace, by putting at the disposition of the planetary community their precious educational methods, after they are repackaged to adequately fulfil the needs of present day lifestyle.

Spiritual traditions can and should make constructive contributions to the organisation of this world, until the planet is a livable place for all beings. The super accelerated changes that have deeply affected global society have induced a great number of people to search for peace, health and happiness in the wrong directions. It is the duty of religious leaders to show to them the correct path. They have to work together on areas of common interest, without losing their cultural and philosophical doctrine, to make available all the ideas of their spiritual tradition. I believe that peace is the wish and objective of everyone - the essence of every religious tradition and the desire of all holy beings. I pray that the World Peace Buddha, Omniscient God, all the divinities and enlightened beings will help us to preserve our ancient inner science techniques, because peace education is the best opportunity we have to attain health and happiness for our children and the future generations of the third millennium.

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# Spiritual Forum for World Peace

A proposal by T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen

Inner peace is the most solid foundation for world peace.

Il religions and spiritual movements promote the spiritual development of their members and look, in one way or another, for the building of inner peace. Religions have sometimes caused wars or at least have been used by social and political leaders to justify wars and different forms of violence and oppression.

At the same time nevertheless, religions and spiritual movements have significantly contributed towards the development of a culture of peace and have fostered world peace by promoting values such as mutual respect, solidarity, compassion and social justice.

The United Nations is the main political forum for world peace. Peace-making and peace keeping are its core functions. Nevertheless there is not appropriate room in that forum for the religions and spiritual movements to be represented and to be actively involved in building world peace. Although some countries have an official religion, in general religions ignore national borders and co-exist within countries and local communities. "Religions must not identify themselves with political, economic or social powers so as to remain free to work for justice and peace".\*

The Governments of the United Nations Member States cannot represent religions and spiritual movements. It is time to give them official recognition within the United Nations and to create for them an appropriate forum within the United Nations environment to hear their voices and actively associate them in the noble task of building world peace.

#### Concepts and Objectives

To fulfill this need we propose the creation of a United Nations Spiritual Forum for World Peace under the General Assembly. The spiritual forum would be a permanent space for the leaders and representatives of all major and minor religions and spiritual movements for dialogue and concertation, as well as a bridge with the political forum. The spiritual forum concept assumes both diversity and commonalities among religions and spiritual movements. The forum will not entail the creation of a new multi religious philosophical doctrine or the ironing out of

cultural religious diversity, but would be based on the holders of each religious tradition and identity, finding out in the dialogue common values, views and goals for concerted action in the search for inner and world peace, with full respect for the right of every group to cultivate, practise and teach its own doctrine.

In this spirit, the spiritual forum is expected to provide the space and channels for facilitating a better knowledge and understanding of the beliefs, ethical codes, organisation and practices of each other, a basic condition for mutual respect; to interchange ideas and work out common views from a spiritual perspective on the major problems and challenges faced by mankind, such as poverty eradication, population growth and protection of the environment; and identify specific areas for concerted action in the promotion of peace.

The spiritual forum will also offer an official channel to the spiritual leaders to speak with one single voice to the political leaders with regard to world peace and to relate to the specialised agencies and funding agencies of the UN system which are responsible for promoting social, economic and environmental development. In order to fulfill its mission, the spiritual forum at international level should be complemented by spiritual forums created at national and local levels which will promote inter-religious dialogue and concerted action for inner and social peace in the communities. Without the active involvement of local communities the spiritual forum would remain only as one more superstructure.

### Complementary outcomes

The effective operation of the spiritual forum at all levels can be expected to:

- 1. Re-energize all religions and spiritual movements by enabling their voices to remain relevant to the billions of citizens of this planet now and in the future.
- 2. Offer new ideas and re-package old ideas in the field of education for peace; and last, but not least.
- 3. Contribute to solve religious conflicts which are now hindering the development of world peace.

# Inner Peace and World Peace now and forever by all the Holy Beings' Blessings

"I would like to be very clear, that although I am the initiator of this proposal, as it is gradually realized and the Spiritual Forum is created both locally, nationally and internationally, that is under the auspices of the United Nations General Assembly, I personally have no wish to be in the forefront of this assembly. My wish is to stay in the background, serving the Spiritual Forum in whichever way I am able, but leaving the leadership to those better qualified to develop this Spiritual United Nations to its fullest potential for the benefit of all humanity.

There are four key points to consider about the Spiritual Forum:

- The Spiritual Forum concept implies working for development of Spiritual Forums for World Peace in our local communities, in our countries and at international level.

- Participants of the Spiritual Forum must respect the rights of every other spiritual group or religion to cultivate, practise and teach its own doctrine.
- That we, the participants of the Spiritual Forum, will respectfully try to understand and be sympathetic to other beliefs, ethical codes, organizations and practices with the aim of sharing and exchanging ideas about how to solve global problems such as war, poverty and environmental degradation.
- That we will work together harmoniously to identify specific areas for concerted action in the promotion of inner and world peace.
- The Spiritual Forum does not entail the creation of a new religious or spiritual doctrine or the loss of cultural-religious diversity; it shall be based on the holders of each religious tradition presenting their own system and philosophy at its best, in an open spirit whilst collaborating with other traditions, to find new perspectives and solutions for the many urgent problems now facing humanity. It is important in the 21st century, both for the development and success of the global village and environment, that religions accept each other and come to some agreement on major issues such as population studies, economy, environment, peace making, and so on. Religions must work together because the harmony of the collective human spirit is the heart of all religions and is beyond any singular religion.
- The proposal aims to create continuously functioning Spiritual Forums for World Peace at both the international (United Nations), national and local levels. I hope that you will now collectively accept the proposal as your own and present it to the United Nations, the main international organ in the creation of world peace. Religious and spiritual traditions can make an important contribution towards the development of world peace and so we should collectively request the United Nations to allow this forum to be realised as soon as possible,"

# "聯合國世界和平宗教論壇"

内心的和平是世界和平最堅穩的基石。

所有宗教和宗教運動皆提倡信徒的精神發展,以及設法建立 内心的和平。

有時,宗教引起了戰爭,或至少被社會和政治領袖利用,作為發動戰爭和各種暴行及迫害的借口。然而,與此同時,宗教和宗教運動也通過提倡高尚的價值觀,例如互相尊敬、團結、慈悲及社會正義,而對和平文化的發展作出莫大的貢獻,并且促進了世界和平。

聯合國是謀求世界和平的主要政治論壇。締結和平與維持和平是它的核心任務。然而,在這個論壇里,各宗教和宗教運動卻沒有得到適當的代表權,以更積極地參與創造世界和平的工作使命。

雖然一些國家有官方宗教 (國教) , 大體上, 宗教超越國界, 在各國和當地社群之間和平共存。"宗教絕對不能牽涉到政治、經濟或社會權力, 才能自由地致力于正義與和平"。聯合國成員國的政府并不能代表宗教和宗教運動。因此聯合國對各宗教和宗教運動應給予正式承認, 以及在聯合國範疇內爲宗教和宗教運動提供適當論壇, 以聽取他們的心聲, 幷且讓他們積極地參與建立世界和平神聖工作的時候已經到來。

### 概念和宗旨

爲了落實這個需要,我們提議在聯合國大會或聯合國教科文 組織下,成立聯合國世界和平宗教論壇。這個宗教論壇將成爲世 界所有主要和次要宗教及宗教運動領袖及代表進行對話和磋商的 永久論壇,也可以作爲和政治論壇溝通的橋樑。

上述宗教論壇的概念以宗教和宗教的多元性及共同性爲基礎。設立這個論壇,不是要制定多元宗教的教義或消除文化宗教的多樣性,而是以各種宗教的傳統及特性爲基礎,异中求同,在對話中尋求共同的價值與觀點,及目標,以采取一致行動,追尋内心和世界的和平,同時完全遵重每一個族群,所奉行及弘揚本身教義的權利與培育。

在這種精神下,這個論壇將可以提供空間和管道,讓各宗教和宗教運動之間,相互認識、了解彼此的信仰、道德準則、組織和習俗,作爲建立相互尊敬的基本條件。此外,這個論壇也可以讓宗教和宗教運動之間,互相交換主意,以及從宗教角度,制定共同立場,以克服人類所面對的各種重大問題及挑戰,例如消除貧窮、人口成長、環境的保護等;同時鑒定特別的領域,以采取一致行動、促進世界和平。

這個宗教論壇也可以作為宗教領袖在世界和平問題上,向政治領袖發表一致言論的正式渠道,和作為宗教領袖和聯合國體系内,負責促進社會、經濟及環境發展的特定組織及提供資金的組織之間溝通的管道。

爲了落實上述宗教論壇在國際上的任務,各國的國家性和地方性宗教論壇應該給予協助和配合。這些國家性和地方性的宗教論壇將促進各社群之間的宗教對話和采取一致行動,謀求社群的内部和社會和平。如果沒有這些當地社群的參與,上述聯合國宗教論壇將有名無實。

### 作用和效用

上述宗教論壇在各層次上有效地運作, 將可達成以下作用:

- \*讓全球現在和未來的無量眾生有機緣聽取各宗教和宗教運動的 心聲, 進而振興宗教。
- \*在和平教育上提出新思想和改進舊思想。
- \*以及對化解目前妨礙世界和平發展的宗教紛爭作出貢獻。

# Forum Spirituel des Nations Unies pour la Paix dans le Monde

La paix intérieure est la base la plus solide pour construire la paix dans le monde.

outes les religions et les mouvements philosophiques prêchent le développement spirituel de leurs membres et cherchent, d'une manière ou d'une autre, à établir la paix intérieure.

Parfois les religions ont causé des guerres ou, du moins, ont été utilisées par des dirigeants sociaux et politiques pour justifier des guerres ou différentes formes de violence et d'oppression. Toutefois, les religions et les mouvements spirituels ont en même temps contribués de façon significative à l'extension d'une culture tournée vers la paix et ont œuvré pour la promouvoir dans le monde en prônant des valeurs comme le respect mutuel, la solidarité, la compassion, et la justice sociale.

Les Nations Unies constituent le principal forum politique responsable de la paix dans le monde. Sa fonction essentielle est d'établir la paix et de la maintenir. Pourtant, aucune place n'est prévue dans ce forum, pour que les religions et les mouvements spirituels soient représentés et puissent participer activement à la construction de la paix mondiale.

Bien que certains pays aient une religion officielle, les courants de pensées ignorent généralement les frontières nationales et coexistent à l'intérieur des pays et des collectivités locales. "Les religions ne doivent pas s'identifier aux pouvoirs politiques, économiques et sociaux, afin de pouvoir œuvrer librement pour la justice et la paix."\* Les gouvernements des états membres de l'O.N.U. ne sont pas en mesure de représenter les religions et les mouvements spirituels. Ainsi, le moment est aujourd'hui venu de les reconnaître officiellement à l'intérieur même de l'O.N.U. et de créer un forum approprié dans le cadre de l'O.N.U. pour qu'ils puissent faire entendre leur voix et contribuer plus activement à la noble tâche d'établir la paix dans le monde.

### Concepts et Objectifs

Pour répondre à ce besoin, nous proposons la création d'un FORUM SPIRITUEL DES NATIONS UNIES POUR LA PAIX MONDIALE, placé sous la juridiction de l'Assemblée Générale. Le Forum Spirituel constituerait un espace permanent de dialogue et de concertation des dirigeants et des représentants de toutes les religions et de tous les mouvements spirituels, majeurs ou mineurs tout en gardant une relation étroite avec le Forum politique.

Le concept du Forum Spirituel tient compte de la diversité et des points que les religions et les mouvements spirituels ont en commun. Le Forum Spirituel n'implique ni la création d'une nouvelle doctrine philosophique muti-religieuse ni le nivellement des diversités culturelles et religieuses. Il s'appuierait sur les fondements de chaque tradition et identité religieuse et, trouverait dans le dialogue des valeurs, des vues, et des objectifs communs afin de mettre en œuvre une action concertée pour la recherche de la paix intérieure et établir la paix dans le monde, tout en respectant le droit de chaque groupe de cultiver, de pratiquer et d'enseigner sa propre doctrine. Afin de pouvoir remplir sa mission au niveau international, le Forum Spirituel devrait être soutenu par d'autres forums spirituels créés au niveau national et local, qui engageraient un dialogue inter religieux et une action concertée pour la paix intérieure et la paix sociale au sein des différentes communautés. Sans la participation active des collectivités locales le Forum Spirituel ne restera qu'une infrastructure de plus.

#### Objectifs Complementaires

- 1. Le fonctionnement effectif du Forum Spirituel devrait: stimuler toutes les religions et les mouvements spirituels afin que leur voix restent pertinentes pour les milliards de citoyens de cette planète, aujourd'hui et à l'avenir.

# Foro Espiritual de las Naciones Unidas para la Paz en el Mundo

Propuesta de T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen

La paz interior es la base más sólida para la paz en el mundo.

odas las religiones y movimientos espirituales promueven el desarrollo espiritual de sus miembros y buscan de una forma u otra alcanzar la paz interior. En ocasiones, las religiones han producido guerras o han sido utilizadas por dirigentes sociales y políticos para justificar conflictos y diferentes formas de violencia y opresión. Sin embargo, al mismo tiempo, las religiones y los movimientos espirituales han contribuido de forma significativa al desarrollo de una cultura de paz y al crecimiento de la paz en el mundo, promoviendo valores tales como el respeto mutuo, la solidaridad, la compasión y la justicia social.

Las Naciones Unidas son el principal foro político para la paz en el mundo. Establecer y mantener la paz son sus funciones centrales. Sin embargo, en dicho foro no hay un lugar adecuado para que las religiones y los movimientos espirituales estén representados y puedan involucrarse de forma activa en la construcción de la paz mundial. Las religiones están por encima de las fronteras nacionales y aunque algunos países tengan una religión oficial, en general, éstas coexisten en naciones y comunidades locales. "Las religiones no deben identificarse con los poderes políticos, económicos o sociales, manteniéndose así libres para trabajar por la justicia y la paz."\*

Los gobiernos de los estados miembros de las Naciones Unidas no pueden representar a las religiones y movimientos espirituales. Es tiempo de darles reconocimiento oficial dentro de la ONU y de crear un foro apropiado que les permita hacer oír sus voces y asociarse activamente en la noble tarea de construir la paz en el mundo.

#### Conceptos y Objetivos

Para satisfacer esta necesidad, proponemos la creación en el ámbito de las Naciones Unidas de un FORO ESPIRITUAL PARA LA PAZ, dependiente de la Asamblea General. El Foro Espiritual sería un espacio permanente para el diálogo y la concertación entre los dirigentes y representantes de todas las religiones mayoritarias o minoritarias y de los movimientos espirituales, así como un puente con el foro político.

El concepto de Foro Espiritual asume, tanto las diferencias, como las afinidades entre las distintas religiones y movimientos espirituales. No se pretende propiciar la creación de una nueva doctrina filosófica multirreligiosa, o la eliminación de la diversidad cultural-religiosa, sino que, apoyándose en la tradición e identidad propia de cada religión, descubrir a través del diálogo, los conceptos, valores y objetivos comunes que hacen posible una acción conjunta en la búsqueda de la paz interior y de la paz en el mundo, con pleno respeto al derecho de cada grupo para cultivar, practicar y enseñar su propia doctrina.

Con este ánimo, se espera que el Foro Espiritual provea el espacio y los canales para facilitar un mejor conocimiento recíproco y una mejor comprensión de las creencias, códigos éticos, organización y prácticas de las diferentes religiones y movimientos espirituales, condición básica para el respeto mutuo; que permita intercambiar ideas y generar puntos de vista comunes desde una perspectiva espiritual sobre los principales problemas y desafíos que afectan a la humanidad, tales como la erradicación de la pobreza, el crecimiento demográfico y la protección del medio ambiente; y por último, facilite la identificación de áreas específicas donde realizar acciones concertadas para la promoción de la paz. Организация Объединенных Наций, основными функциями которой являются установление и поддержание мира, является ведущей политической трибуной борцов за мир во всем мире. Остается лишь с сожалением заметить, что на столь видном политическом форуме представителям различных религиозных течений и направлений не отводится подобающее им место и роль, что, в свою очередь, не позволяет религиозным деятелям развернуть более активную работу на поприще борьбы за мир во всем мире.

Для религии не существует национальных границ, несмотря на то, что во многих странах выбрана и принята одна в качестве официальной. Поскольку Форум зиждется на уважении религиозных традиций и воззрений, основное внимание будет уделяться налаживанию диалога, выявлению общих ценностей, задач и перспектив с тем, чтобы на этой основе развить сотрудничество в плане поиска путей "водворения благоволения в человеке" и установления мира на земле. Достижение указанной цели будет осуществляться при строгом соблюдении права любой религиозной общины на проповедь своих мировоззрений и исполнение религиозных обрядов.

lle Religionen und spirituelle Bewegungen unterstützen die spirituelle Entwicklung ihrer Mitglieder und suchen auf die eine oder andere Wiese Inneren Friede herzustellen.

Des öfteren haben Religionen Krieg verursacht, oder wurden zumindest von sozialen und politischen Führern dazu benutzt, Krieg und verschiedene Formen von Gewalt und Unterdrückung zu rechtfertigen. Dennoch, haben religiöse und spirituelle Bewegungen gleichzeitig bedeutend zur Entwicklung einer Kultur des Friedens beigetragen, und haben Weltfrieden geförert indem sie Werte wie gegenseitingen Respekt, Solidarität, Mitgefühl und soziale Gerechtigkeit unterstützen. Die Vereinten Nationen sind das wichtigste politische Forum für den Weltfrieden. Es gehört zu seinen Hauptaufgaben, Frieden herzustellen und Frieden zu erhalten. Jedoch besteht bislang innerhalb dieses Forums noch kein geeigneter Raum, in dem die religiösen und spirituellen Bewegungen zu repräsentieren werden und so aktiv an der Konstruktion des Weltfrieden teilnehmen könnten.

Selbst wenn manche Länder eine offizielle Religion haben, ignorieren Religionen im allgemeinen nationale Grenzen. Sie koexistieren innerhalb von Ländern und Gemeinden. "Religionen dürfen sich nicht mit polistischen, ökonimischen oder sozialen Kräften identifizieren, um für die Arbeit für Gerechtheit und Friede frei zu sein."\* Die Regierungen der Mitgliedsstaaten der UN können die religiösen und spirituellen Bewegungen nicht repräsentieren. Es ist an der Zeit ihnen offizielle Anerkennung innerhalb der UN zu gewähren und ein angemessenes Forum für sie ins Leben zu rufen, in dem ihre Stimmen gehört werden können. So können sie aktiv an der edlen Aufgabe, Weltfrieden herzustellen, mitwirken.

#### Vorstellungen und Ziele

Um diese Aufgabe zu erfüllen schlagen wir die Gründung eines SPIRITUELLES FORUMS DER VEREINTEN NATIONEN FÜR WELTFRIEDEN vor, innerhalb der Allgemeinen Versammlung der Vereinten Nationen. Das Spirituelle Forum könnte die dauerhafte Möglichkeit für die Versammlung der Führer und Repräsentanten aller größeren und kleineren religiösen und spirituellen Bewegungen und für ihren Austausch geben. Es könnte gleichzeitig eine Brücke zum politischen Forum sein.

Die Vorstellung von einem Spirituellen Forum setzt die Einbeziehung der Unterschiede wischen den religiösnen und spirituellen Bewegungen sowie die ihrer Gemeinsamkeiten voraus. Das Forum beinhaltet nicht die Gründung einer multi-religiösen philosophischen Doktrine oder

das Ausbügeln von kulturell-religiöser Verschiedenheit. Es basiert vielmehr auf dem Dialogue zwischen Führern einer jeden religiösen Tradition und Identität: Gemeinsame Werte, Ansichten und Ziele sollten für gemeinsamen Handlungen auf der Suche nach Innerem Frieden und Weltfrieden gefunden werden. Dabei soll das Recht jeder Gruppe, ihre eigene Lehrmeinung zu pflegen, auszuüben und zu lehren voll respektiert werden.

In diesem Sinne, wird von dem Spirituellen Forum erwartet, daß es den Raum und die Kanäle bietet um besseres Wissen und Verständnis für die Glaubensrichtungen, Sittlichkeitsregeln, für die Organisation und die Praxis der anderen zu ermöglichen. So soll eine allgemeine Grundlage für gegenseitigen Respekt geschaffen werden. Das Austauschen von Ideen und das Erarbeiten von gemeinsamen Ansichten über die Hauptprobleme der Menschheit und die Herausforderungen an sie vom spirituellen Gesichtspunt aus erfolgen: z.B. auf den Gebieten von Armut, Ausrottung, Bevölkerungswachstum und Umweltschutz. Für gemeinsame Handlungen zur Unterstützung des Friedens sollen bestimmte Gebiete herausgearbeiten wedern. Das Spirituelle Forum wird weiterhin den spirituellen Führeren einen offiziellen Verbindungskanal bieten, um mit vereinter Stimme zu den politischen Fürern bezüglich des Weltfriedens zu sprechen und um sich mit spezialisierten Agenturen und solchen für die finanziellen Unterstützung des UN-systems in Verbindung zu setzen, die für die soziale, die wirtschaftlishe und die Entntwicklung der Umwelt zuständig sind.

Um seine Mission auf internationaler Ebene zu erfüllen, sollte das Spirituelle Forum von spirituellen Foren auf nationaler und lokalerEbene ergänzt werden. Diese sollten den interreligiösen Austausch und vereinte Handlung für inneren und soziale Frieden in den Gemeinden unterstützen. Ohne die aktive Mitarbeit der örtlichen Gemeinden wäre das Spirituelle Forum nur noch eine weitere Überstruktur.

#### Ergänzende Resultate

Von der erfolgreichen Ausübung des Spirituellen Forums kann erwartet werden:

- 1. Eine Reaktivirung aller religiösen und spirituellen Bewegungen, dadurch daß die Bedeutung ihrer Stimme für billionen von Bürgern dieses Planeten erhalten bleibt, jetzt und in der Zukunft
- 2. Das Anbieten neuer Ideen und die Neuverpackung alter Ideen auf dem Gebiet der Ausbildung für den Frieden
- 3. Ein Beitrag zur Lösung von religiösen Konflikten, die bislang die Entwicklung des Weltfriedens behindern.

#### Inneren Frieden und Weltfriede Jetzt und für Immer, Durch den Segen aller Heiligen Wesen

"Folgendes möchte ich gerne klarstellen: Zwar habe ich diesen Vorschlag initiert habe, doch sollte er in die Tat umgesetzt und das Spirituelle Forum unter der Schirmherrschaft der Allgemeinen Versammlung der Vereinten Nationen gegründet werden - ist es nicht mein Wunsch, im Vordergrund zu stehen. Vielmehr möchte ich im Hintergrund bleiben, und dem Spirituellen Forum auf best mögliche Weise dienen. Die Führungsposition hihgegen möchte ich qualifizirteren Kräften überlassen, damit sich die Spirituellen Vereinten Nationen zum Wohle der Menschheit zu ihrem höchsten Potential zu entwickeln können."

# Fórum Espiritual das Nações Unidas pela Paz Mundial

Uma proposta de T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen

A paz interna é a base mais sólida para a paz mundial.

odas as religiões e movimentos espirituais promovem o desenvolvimento espiritual de seus membros e se preocupam, de alguma maneira com a construção da paz.

Algumas vezes as religiões provocaram guerras, ou foram usadas por líderes políticos e sociais para justificar guerras ou diferentes formas de violência ou opressão.

Ao mesmo tempo, as religiões e os movimentos espirituais contribuíram de forma significativa para o desenvolvimento de uma cultura de paz e promoveram a paz mundial, valorizando os conceitos de respeito mútuo, solidariedade, compaixão e justiça social. A Organização das Nações Unidas é o principal fórum político para a paz mundial. Construir e manter a paz são suas funções essenciais. Mesmo assim não existe, nesta organização, um espaço próprio para a representação e trabalho ativo das religiões e dos movimentos espirituais na construção da paz mundial.

De um modo geral as religiões ignoram as fronteiras nacionais e coexistem dentro dos países e comunidades. "As religiões não devem se identificar com poderes políticos, sociais ou econômicos para se manterem livres em seu trabalho pela justiça e pela paz."\*

Os governos dos estados membros da ONU não podem representar movimentos espirituais ou religiosos. É chegado o momento de lhes oferecer reconhecimento oficial dentro das Nações Unidas, e de criar um fórum apropriado para ouvir suas vozes e associá-los ativamente na nobre tarefa de construir a paz mundial.

#### Conceitos e Objetivos

Para tanto, propomos a criação do Fórum Espiritual das Nações Unidas pela Paz Mundial sob a proteção da Assembléia Geral. O Fórum Espiritual será um espaço permanente para os líderes e representantes de todas as pequenas e grandes religiões e movimentos espirituais poderem dialogar, tornando-se assim uma ponte para o Fórum Político. O conceito do Fórum Espiritual não imporá a criação de uma nova doutrina multi-religiosa-filosófica. Não pretende extinguir a diversidade cultural religiosa, mas será baseado no conteúdo de cada tradição e identidade, descobrindo através do diálogo, os valores, conceitos e objetivos comuns para agirem de pleno acordo em busca da paz interna e mundial, mantendo o direito de cada grupo cultivar, praticar e ensinar a sua própria doutrina.

Dentro deste espírito, o Fórum Espiritual deverá: - Oferecer espaço e canais que propiciem um melhor conhecimento e compreensão das crenças, códigos éticos, organização e práticas de cada um, condições básicas para o respeito mútuo. - Trocar idéias e desenvolver planos conjuntos a partir de uma perspectiva espiritual, para os principais problemas e desafios da humanidade, tais como a erradicação da pobreza, o crescimento populacional, a proteção do meio-ambiente. - Identificar áreas para a ação comum, na promoção da paz.

Para cumprir esta missão internacionalmente, o fórum deverá ser complementado por fóruns nacionais e locais que promoverão diálogos inter-religiosos e ações comuns para a paz interna e social nas comunidades. Sem o envolvimento ativo das comunidades locais, o fórum permaneceria apenas como mais uma superestrutur

#### **Efeitos Complementares**

Espera-se que a operação efetiva do Fórum Espiritual possa em todos os níveis:

- 1. Re-energizar todas as religiões e movimentos espirituais ao lhes dar relevância diante de milhões de cidadãos deste planeta agora e no futuro.
- 2. Oferecer novas idéias e recondicionar as já existentes no campo da educação para a paz.
- 3. Contribuir para dissolver conflitos religiosos que no momento atrasam o desenvolvimento da paz mundial.

#### Pelo Poder da Verdade Paz Interna e Mundial agora e Sempre

"Quero deixar bem claro que, embora eu seja o criador desta proposta, caso ela se concretize e o Fórum Espiritual for criado sob os auspícios da Assembléia Geral da ONU, pessoalmente não pretendo estar à frente do projeto. Meu desejo é estar na retaguarda, servindo ao Fórum Espiritual da melhor forma que puder, deixando, porém, a liderança àqueles melhor qualificados para desenvolver o Fórum Espiritual das Nações Unidas em seu potencial máximo, pelo benefício de toda a humanidade.

Existem quatro pontos a serem considerados sobre o Fórum Espiritual:

- O seu conceito implica trabalhar pelo desenvolvimento do Fórum Espiritual pela Paz Mundial nas nossas comunidades locais, em nossos países e a nível internacional.
- Os participantes do Fórum Espiritual precisam respeitar os direitos de cada grupo espiritual ou religião no cultivo, prática e ensino da sua própria doutrina.

Estará baseado nos pilares de cada tradição religiosa, que dentro de um espírito aberto, ao apresentar o melhor do seu próprio sistema e filosofia, colabora com outras tradições no encontro de novas perspectivas e soluções comuns para muitos problemas urgentes que a humanidade está se deparando. - A proposta visa criar Fóruns Espirituais que funcionem continuamente pela Paz Mundial tanto nos níveis internacional (Nações Unidas), nacional e local. Espero que vocês aceitem coletivamente a proposta como sendo sua, e a apresentem para a ONU, o órgão internacional principal para a criação da paz mundial. As tradições espirituais e religiosas podem fazer um importante contribuição para o desenvolvimento da paz no mundo, e assim devemos coletivamente pedir à ONU que permita este fórum ser realizado o mais rápido possível."

### Spiritueel Forum voor Wereld Vrede

Een Voorstel van T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen

Innerlijke vrede is de meest solide basis voor wereld vrede.

lle religies en spirituele bewegingen bevorderen de spirituele ontwikkeling van hunaanhangers en zijn op zoek naar manieren om innerlijke vrede te ontwikkelen. Religies hebben soms oorlogen veroorzaakt of zijn op zijn minst door sociale en politieke leiders gebruikt om oorlogen en verschillende vormen van geweld en onderdrukking te rechtvaardigen.

Tegelijkertijd hebben religies en spirituele bewegingen niettemin aanmerkelijk bijgedragen aan de ontwikkeling van een cultuur van vrede en hebben wereld vrede gekoesterd door het bevorderen van waarden zoals wederzijds respect, solidariteit, mededogen en sociale rechtvaardigheid.

De Verenigde Naties is het voornaamste politieke forum voor wereld vrede. Het stichten van vrede en het handhaven van vrede vormen de kernfuncties. Niettemin is er geen geëigend platform voor de religies en spirituele bewegingen om in dat forum vertegenwoordigd te zijn en actief betrokken te zijn bij het ontwikkelen van wereld vrede.

Hoewel sommige landen een officiële religie hebben, houden religies zich in het algemeen niet aan nationale grenzen en coëxisteren binnen landen en lokale gemeenschappen. "Religies moeten zich niet identificeren met politieke, economische, of sociale krachten om zo vrij te blijven om te werken voor rechtvaardigheid en vrede."

De regeringen van de lidstaten van de Verenigde Naties kunnen geen religies en spirituele stromingen vertegenwoordigen. Het is tijd om religies en spirituele stromingen een officiële erkenning te geven binnen de Verenigde Naties en voor hen een eigen forum te creëren binnen de Verenigde Naties om zo hun stem te laten horen en hen gezamenlijk actief te betrekken bij de edele taak van het bevorderen van wereld vrede.

#### Concepten en doelstellingen

Om aan deze behoefte te voldoen, doen we het voorstel om een Verenigde Naties Spiritueel Forum voor Wereld Vrede te creëren binnen de Algemene Vergadering. Het Spiritueel Forum zal een permanente ruimte moeten zijn voor de leiders en vertegenwoordigers van alle grote en kleine religies en spirituele stromingen waar plaats is voor dialoog en samenwerking, alsmede een brug moeten vormen met het politieke forum. Het concept van het Spiritueel Forum veronderstelt zowel diversiteit als overeenkomsten tussen religies en spirituele stromingen. Het

forum zal niet leiden tot de vorming van een nieuwe multi-religieuze leer of het gladstrijken van de culturele filosofische diversiteit, maar zal er vanuit gaan dat de leiders van elke religieuze traditie en identiteit in dialoog gemeenschappelijke waarden, opvattingen en doelen ontdekken voor samenwerking bij het zoeken naar innerlijke en wereld vrede, met volledig respect voor het recht van elke groepering om de eigen leer te cultiveren, te beoefenen en te onderwijzen.

In deze geest wordt verwacht dat het Spiritueel Forum de ruimte en kanalen zal verschaffen voor een betere kennis en begrip van de overtuigingen, ethische codes, organisatie en beoefeningen van elkaar - een basisvoorwaarde voor wederzijds respect - om vanuit een spiritueel perspectief ideeën met elkaar uit te wisselen en gemeenschappelijke standpunten uit te werken over de grootste problemen en uitdagingen waarmee de mens geconfronteerd wordt, zoals het uitroeien van armoede, bevolkingsgroei en milieubescherming; en daarbij specifieke terreinen aan te wijzen die in aanmerking komen voor samenwerking bij het promoten van vrede.

Door zijn officiële status zal het Spiritueel Forum spirituele leiders in staat stellen om met betrekking tot wereld vrede eenstemmig tot de politieke leiders te spreken en contact te hebben met de gespecialiseerde vertegenwoordigingen en de fondsenverwervende vertegenwoordigingen van het VN systeem welke verantwoordelijk zijn voor het stimuleren van sociale, economische en milieu ontwikkeling. Om zijn missie uit te kunnen voeren moet het Spiritueel Forum op internationaal niveau aangevuld worden door Spirituele Forums op nationaal en lokaal niveau, die de interreligieuze dialoog en samenwerking voor innerlijke en sociale vrede in de samenleving zullen stimuleren. Zonder de actieve betrokkenheid van de plaatselijke gemeenschap zou het Spiritueel Forum niets anders zijn dan weer een superstructuur.

#### Aanvullende resultaten

De effectieve werking van het Spiritueel Forum op alle niveaus kan naar verwachting:

- 1. Een nieuwe stimulans geven aan alle religies en spirituele stromingen door de mogelijkheid te bieden hun stem blijvend te laten horen in het belang van de miljarden burgers van deze planeet nu en in de toekomst.
- 2. Nieuwe ideeën aanbieden en oude ideeën in nieuwe vormen gieten op het gebied van vredeseducatie; en als laatste maar niet het minste
- 3. Een bijdrage leveren aan het oplossen van religieuze conflicten die momenteel de ontwikkeling van wereld vrede belemmeren.

Er zijn vier kernpunten ter overweging betreffende het Spiritueel Forum:

- Het concept Spiritueel Forum impliceert het werken aan de ontwikkeling van Spirituele Forums voor Wereld Vrede in onze lokale gemeenschappen, in onze landen en op internationaal niveau.
- Deelnemers aan het Spiritueel Forum moeten het recht van elke andere spirituele stroming of religie respecteren om de eigen leer te cultiveren, te beoefenen en te onderwijzen.

- Dat wij, de deelnemers aan het Spiritueel Forum, proberen om respect, begrip en sympathie te hebben voor andere geloven, overtuigingen, ethische principes, organisaties en beoefeningen met als doel het delen en uitwisselen van ideeën over het oplossen van de wereldproblemen zoals oorlog, armoede, en vervuiling van de omgeving.
- Dat we in harmonie zullen samenwerken om specifieke gebieden vast te stellen voor een gezamenlijke actie om innerlijke en wereld vrede te bevorderen.
- Het Spiritueel Forum zal niet leiden tot de vorming van een nieuwe religieuze of spirituele leer of het verlies van de cultureel-religieuze diversiteit. Het zal zich richten tot de leiders van elke religieuze traditie die het beste uit hun systeem of filosofie inbrengen, om met een open geest en in samenwerking met andere tradities nieuwe perspectieven en oplossingen te vinden voor de vele urgente problemen waar de mensheid nu mee wordt geconfronteerd. Het is in de 21ste eeuw belangrijk dat de religies elkaar accepteren en tot een zekere overeenstemming komen ten aanzien van belangrijke onderwerpen als bevolkingsvraagstukken, economie, milieu, stichten van vrede, enz., zowel voor de ontwikkeling als het welslagen van deze wereld en het milieu. Religies moeten samenwerken omdat de eensgezindheid van de collectieve menselijke geest het hart vormt van alle religies, en boven welke religie dan ook uitstijgt.
- Het voorstel heeft als doel het verkrijgen van een continu functionerend Spiritueel Forum voor Wereld Vrede op VN, internationaal, nationaal en lokaal niveau. Ik hoop dat jullie dit voorstel nu zullen accepteren, als was het jullie eigen voorstel, en het zullen aanbieden aan de Verenigde Naties, het belangrijkste internationale orgaan voor het creëren van wereld vrede. Religieuze en spirituele tradities kunnen een belangrijke bijdrage leveren aan de ontwikkeling van wereld vrede. Daarom moeten we gezamenlijk de Verenigde Naties verzoeken toe te staan dat dit forum zo spoedig mogelijk wordt gerealiseerd.

1. Santiago, Chile, 8th of June 1995 at ECLAC, (the Latin American Headquarters of the United Nations Economic Commission).

T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen presented his proposal for a United Nations Spiritual Forum for World Peace to an audience of 150 United Nations officials and special guests.

2. Dorset England, June 15th to 19th 1995.

First Solstice World Peace Prayers in Stonehenge's Inner Circle Temple and Festival of Healing with Lama Gangchen at Gaunts House. Historical event at Stonehenge, which marked the re-opening of this sacred site to the ancient pagan traditions.

- 3. Ulan Baator, Mongolia on the 7th of August 1995 at the Peace Committee. Organized by J. Choinkhor, Deputy Foreign Minister and President of the Mongolian National Commission for UNESCO and attended by: Dr. G. Lubsantsern, Secretary General of the Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace; B. Wangchindorj, former Foreign Minister of Mongolia; Sheringdeva, former Deputy Prime Minister; and several important representatives of monasteries and peace organisations.
- 4. Kathmandu, Nepal on the 1st of September 1995 at the Russian Cultural Centre. Attended by: Chief Guest, the Rt. Hon. Beni Bahadur Karki, Chairman, National Council; HMG of Nepal. Guests: four members of Raj Sabha Standing Committe; three former Ministers; six representatives of associations and organisations, and seven representatives of societies.
- 5. Munich, Germany, at Haus International, 15th to the 17th of September 1995.
- 6. Montignac Dordogne, France at the Salle des Fêtes, 14th of October 1995. The annual Forum was attended by over 1.500 people among whom Anne and Daniel Meurois-Givaudan; Emile Moatti, vice-president of the "Fraternité d'Abraham" and member of the administration of the "World Conference on Religion and Peace" for France; as well as various religious representatives and scientists. Lama Gangchen presented the Proposal and gave a lecture on the importance of Inner Peace Education. A portrait gallery was dedicated to great spiritual personalities of various religion, such as Christianity, Buddhism, Islam, Judaism and Bahai. Each participant received a copy of the Proposal by Lama Gangchen personally.
- 7. Perugia, Italy, 20th to the 24th of September 1995.

Commemoration Celebration of the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of the United Nations, and Peace Walk from Perugia to Assisi. Lama Gangchen presented the Proposal to the Assembly of the UN representatives and participated in the Peace Walk, attended by representatives of over 175 different countries, including important personalities, such as Betty William, Nobel Peace Laureat in 1975 (Ireland); Maria Pia Fanfani (Together for Peace Foundation); Nadia Younes, Director of UNIC Rome, Italy.

## 8. New York, USA, on the occasion of the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of the United Nations, 17th to the 23rd of October 1995.

Lama Gangchen attended an NGO briefing held at the Dag Hammerskjold Auditorium on the 19th of October, followed by a prayer which he held outside the United Nations Meditation Hall with a small delegation. On this occasion Lama Gangchen talked to and personally handed out the Proposal to all present. On the 21st and 22nd, he took part in the "Visions for the 21st Century" symposium organized by the Temple of Understanding and the Council of Religious and Interfaith Organizations.

Saturday the 21st of October, at the Cathedral of St John the Divine, attended by: Rev. James Parks Morton, Dean, Cathedral of St John the Divine and President: Temple of Understanding; Dr Karan Singh, Chair: Temple of Understanding; Ambassador Douglas Roche, Chair: UN 50th Anniversary Committee, Canada, and Advisor to the Holy See Mission to the UN; President Oscar Arias, Nobel Peace Prize; and many spiritual leaders and representatives of the various religious denominations. Lama Gangchen talked to and personally handed out the Proposal to everyone present at the symposium.

He took part in the Inter religious Procession in the Cathedral as the representative for Tibetan Buddhism. On this occasion Lama Gangchen twice offered a dedication to World Peace with a prayer and a song. Sunday the 22nd of October, at the St Vartan Armenian Cathedral Auditorium, attended by Rev. Khajag Barsamian Primate, Diocese of the Armenian Church in North America; Rev. Kyotaro Deguchi, leader Oomoto (Japan) delegation; Sir Sigmund Sternberg, Chair: International Council of Christians and Jews, London UK; Preminder N. Jain (Bawa), Vice Chair of NGOs at the United Nations & UN Representative International Mahavir Jain Mission; Rev. Dr Joan Campbel, Gen. Sec., National Council of churches; Dr Alwi Shilab, Religious Affairs, Agama Dept, Indonesia; Dr Arthur Herzberg, Rabbi Emeritus, Professor of the Humanities, New York University; as well as spiritual leaders and representatives from the various religious denominations. Lama Gangchen presented his Proposal and gave a speech on the need for Inner Peace Education.

## 9. London, England: Westminster Abbey, on the 24th of October 1995. On the occasion of the United Nations 50th Anniversary celebrations.

The service, led by the Very Rev. Michael Mayne, Dean of Westminster, was attended by participating representatives of various faiths communities such as the Rev. Rabbi Edward Jackson; Bruce Ginsberg; Hugh Adamson; the Most Rev. Archbishop Desmond Tutu, and other worldwide visiting spiritual and political representatives and personalities; Alexander Borg Oliver, director, UN office in London. Lama Gangchen personally handed out the Proposal on this occasion and attended a reception where he met with Archbishop Desmond Tutu and several other worldwide spiritual representatives and personalities.

# 10. Chicago, USA 19th & 20th of November 1995: The Council for a Parliament of the World's Religions and the Millennium Institute at North Shore Congregation Israel.

Lama Gangchen presented the Proposal and took part in the Millennium Moment Roundtable, making a gift of the "United Nations Spiritual Forum for World Peace" proposal to the Projects 2000 for the Third Millennium. The two day meeting was hosted by Rabbi Herbert Bronstein and chaired by Rabbi Herman Schaalman, Rabbi Emeritus, Congregation Emanuel, Chicago, and

by P.N. Bawa Jain, vice-Chair, NGO Committee, United Nations.   The proposal was distributed to those present at the meditation, now traditionally held by the Lama Gangchen World Peace Foundation, and lead by Professor Ngawang Sherap, from the Foundation.

#### 49. UNIC, Buenos Aires, Argentina, on the 14th of October 1997.

The second reunion for the United Nations Spiritual Forum for World Peace Proposal organized by the L.G.W.P.F. was chaired by Mr Angel Escudero de Paz, Director of UNIC-Argentina and Uruguay, in the presence of Lama Gangchen and representatives of Brahma Kumari; Orden Sufi Nagshlandi; Temple Chong Kuan (Buddhist); Jewish Community; Community of studies of the first Nations of America (Indigenous People); "Groupo de Contactos Alejandria" Humanistic Movement; Centro Sri Sathya, NGO Sanitaria (Spain).

#### 50. Caracas, Venezuela, on the 29th of October 1997

Lama Gangchen was invited by the Catedra UNESCO for a Peace Culture' to present the Proposal during an inter-religious meeting at the Peace Monument to inaugurate the activities in preparation of the inter-religious and inter-cultural conference which is to be held in Caracas in April 1998.

## 51. Himalayan Healing Centre in Kathmandu, Nepal, from the 26th to the 28th of February 1998.

On the occasion of the second International Congress on Alternative Medicines and Non-Formal Education, organised by the L.G.W.P.F - in honour of Nepal's Year for Tourism O98 - with the high patronage of the Ministry for Tourism and Civil Aviation and the Baneswor Lions Club, Nepal.

## 52. Caracas, Venezuela, Regional Inter-religious and Inter-Cultural Conference, 19th to 23rd of April 1998.

Organized by UNESCO Chair - Planeta Libre for United Religions Initiative (URI), with the participation of 65 representatives from 17 different faiths and religious organizations

#### 53. Gaunts House, England, Interfaith Conversations, 18th to the 23rd of June 1998.

The five day event centered around panel discussions as well as prayers and meditations for World Peace. A Flag and peace pole ceremony with the World Peace Prayer Society (WPPS) was held with the participation of Sister Jayanti (Brahma Kumaris), Mrs Rabia Joyce Purcell (Commonwealth Parliament Ass.), Rabbi Cliff Cohen, Swami Saradananda, Rt Rev Christopher Budd (Bishop of Plymouth), Tii Antonio Chiriap (Shaman from the indiginous Shuar community of Pikiur in the Ecuadorian Amazon), Indarajit Singh (Hon Director of the Sikh organisations in UK and rep. at UN Assoc. Religious Advisory Council), Jehangir Sarosh (Zoroastrian co-chairman of the World Conference of Religions for Peace), Rev. Mother Catarina Boyer OSB (Catholic). A special world peace and prayer ceremony was held at Stonehenge to celebrate the summer solstice.

#### 54. House of Lords, London, England, on the 17th of June 1998.

Lama Gangchen was invited to speak about and present the work of the Spiritual Forum for World Peace to the seminar on "Policy, Ethics and Values" organised by the International Institute of Peace Studies and Global Philosophy, hosted by Lord McNair.

#### 55. Belem, Brazil, Municipal Town Hall, on July 22nd 1998.

Lama Gangchen was personally received by the Mayor of the City, Mr Edmilson Brito Rodrigues, who is very much interested in the project and in a collaboration of the city of Belem with the L.G.W.P.F. for a project on religious tolerance, peace and environmental awareness to be launched by the end of this year. The first public meeting in Belem was attended by approx. 200 participants from various faiths, peace organizations, environmentalist groups, indigenous people's representatives and religious institutions.

#### 57. Brasilia, Brazil, July 29th 1998.

In Brasilia Lama Gangchen had private meetings with the Secretary for Human Rights at the Ministery of Justice, Dr Jose Gregori, and with the Governor of the Federal District, Cristovam Buarque, who warmly welcomed all his peace projects and requested him to extend his activities to Brasilia.

58. Floranopolis, Brazil, at the State Bank of the State of St Catarina, July 31st 1998. The third local forum meeting was held with the participation of 14 religious representatives, environmental associations and the non-violence movement; 150 people participated in the public meeting.

#### 59. Sao Paulo, Brazil, at the Hebraica, August 2nd 1998.

The fourth annual meeting for the Spiritual Forum for World Peace was held at the Hebraica in Sao Paulo dedicated to the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The organizational meeting was attended by 60 members of 18 different faiths.

## 60. Sao Paulo, 9th World Congress of IAEWP, August 3rd to the 7th 1998. The Proposal was warmly received as a contribution towards the development

of international peace education for a culture of Peace.

#### 61. Sao Paulo, Legion of Goodwill, Rio de Janeiro August 8th 1998.

Lama Gangchen was invited to the annual celebrations of LGW, attended by over 1500 people. The president of this international UN affiliated NGO, Jose Piava Netto, offered support and active collaboration in the Proposal.

#### 62. Santiago, Chile, ECLAC, August 11th 1998.

Lama Gangchen had a private meeting with the Executive Secretary of ECLAC, Dr Jose Antonio Ocampo for discussing future potential for the realization of the proposal.

#### 63. Santiago, Chile, August, 14th 1998.

Private meeting with the Bishop of Santiago, Francisco Javier Errazuriz, to discuss the Proposal.

#### 64. Santiago, Chile, August 15th 1998.

Lama Gangchen attended the eighteenth meeting of the local spiritual forum in which specific projects for a Chilean Peace Television, peace education projects etc. were concluded.

# 65. Olinda, Brasil, Society of Artists and Workers, on the 17th and 18th of August 1998. Meeting with the Abbot of the Benedictine Monastery of Olinda, and the Mayor of Olinda.

#### 66. Paris, France, UNESCO, on the 23rd of September 1998.

Lama Gangchen met with UNESCO's Director General, Federico Mayor-Zaragoza and presented him with the Proposal.

#### 67. London, England, House of Lords, on the 28th of September 1998.

Lama Gangchen was invited back to a special meeting of the forum on "Policy, Ethics and Values" which saw the launch of the All Party Parliamentary Group for Peace and Reconciliation and the launch in the United Kingdom of a local chapter of the Spiritual Forum for World Peace, working in association with the International Institute of Peace Studies and Global Philosophy and the Multifaith and Multicultural Mediation Service.

## 68. Monastery of Saint Giovanni, Parma; and Monastery of Saint Anselmo, Rome, Italy, on the 3rd and 6th of October 1998.

During a Hindu-Christian interfaith conference "People of Peace in a World of War", Lama Gangchen presented the Proposal and took part in a panel discussion.

#### 69. Vatican, Rome, on the 7th of October 1998.

Lama Gangchen personally presented the Proposal to H.H. Pope John Paul II.

#### 70. New York, USA; 4th of November 1998.

An original copy of the Spiritual Forum Report 1995 to 1998 "A solution for the Third Millennium" in nine languages was presented to Mr Alfredo Sfeir-Younis, Special Representative of the World Bank to the United Nations.

#### 71. United Nations, New York, USA, November 5th 1998.

A Solution for the Third Millennium - a "Golden Book" of the Proposal for the creation of a permanent spiritual forum for world peace at the United Nations translated into nine languages, with a full report of its activities from 1995 - 1998, was presented to the Assistant Secretary General of the United Nations, Mrs Sorensen, for the Secretary General Mr Kofi Annan.

#### 72. United Nations, New York November 18th 1998.

(On the occasion of the Unveiling of a lifesize elephant sculpture gifted to the United Nations by three elephant countries, namely: Kenya, Namibia and Nepal, received by Secretary General,) a peace Sand mandala featuring traditional religious and spiritual symbols for global peace and harmony, as emphasised in the "United Nations Spiritual Forum for World Peace". Was presented to the United Nations, and received by Mrs Sorensen for the Secretary General.

# 73. National Council of Churches in Australia, Sidney, Australia, 25th of November 1998. 



## Peace advocate

T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen's activities to promote Inner and World Peace Education, Non-Formal Education, Tantric Self-Healing and Environmental Care



Lama Gangchen was born in western Tibet in 1941. He was recognized at an early age to be a reincarnate lama healer and was enthroned at Gangchen Choepeling monastery at the age of five. When he reached the age of twelve he received the "Kachen" degree which is usually conferred after twenty years of study. Between the ages of thirteen and eighteen, he studied medicine, astrology, meditation and philosophy in two of the major monastic universities of Tibet: Sera and Tashi Lhumpo. He also studied in Gangchen Gompa, Tropu Gompa, and Neytsong Monastery. In 1963, he went into exile to India where he continued his studies for the next seven years at the Varanasi Sanskrit University (Bishwa Vhidhyiana) in Benares. In 1970, he received the Geshe

Rigram diploma from Sera Monastic University situated in South India. After his graduation, he worked as a lama healer among the Tibetan communities in Nepal, India and Sikkim, during which time he saved the lives of many people and was named private physician to the Royal Family.

In 1981, Lama Gangchen visited Europe for the first time and has since become a resident and Italian citizen. In the same year, he also established his first European centre: Karuna Choetsok in Lesbos, Greece, where he is known to have planted a bodhi tree in the 'Buddha Garden', and in the centre of which he consecrated what was to become the first of a long line of World Peace Buddha statues, thankas and images.

Since 1982, he has travelled extensively, both healing and teaching worldwide, leading many pilgrimages to some of the most important holy places of different religious and spiritual denominations in the world.

In 1988, he opened his first residential dharma centre outside of Asia: "Shide Choe Tsok" - Peace Dharma Centre - in Sao Paulo, Brazil. At present he has 100 Inner Peace Education Centres for better living worldwide. Since coming to the West in 1982, Lama Gangchen's activities have taken on an ever increasing worldwide scope towards the achievement of World Peace.

Chiefly, it began with the founding of:

The Kunpen Lama Gangchen Institute for the propagation and preservation of the Tibetan medical tradition in Milan, Italy in 1989. Here Lama Gangchen has initiated the first extensive programmes of Himalayan medical and astrological studies for western students. Also concerned with the preservation of the Himalayan culture, the centre holds courses in buddhist philosophy, thangkha painting and other arts; inviting many groups of Tibetan monks from Indaia and Nepal to Europe to make sand mandalas and perform sacred Cham dances, all of which are dedicated to world peace.

A centre for meditation, peace education, buddhist studies and therapies for mind and body under the spiritual guidance of T.Y.S. Lama Gangchen. At some 600 metres above sea level, it nestles between the nature reserve "Sacro Monte della Santissima Trinita" and the "Val Grande" mountain range, overlooking the panoramic views of the lake. Surrounded by pine and chestnut woodlands, Albagnano is an ideal place to get away from the hustle and bustle of city life, and enter a more friendly and uncontaminated environment, ideal for walks in the unspoilt woodlands.
